



ENÉE ZELLWEGER may or may not have had her eyebrows lifted, but the Bridget Jones's Diary star was raising plenty of eyebrows when she debuted what looked to be a drastically different appearance during the Elle Women in Hollywood awards on Oct. 20 at L.A.'s Four Seasons Hotel. Renée's wider eyes, higher forehead and narrower face set off a firestorm of comments in the days following the event, with widespread speculation that plastic surgery was behind her new look. But it was during the same gala's after party, at Soho House West Hollywood, where the actress' apparently radically redesigned features first caused a real stir and some embarrassing moments for Renée.

"Soho House is a private members' club with a strict policy that every visitor has to check in with an attendant on the first floor," a source tells Star, "Though Renée is a member, the staffer didn't recognize her and thought she was just some party crasher trying to get in! Thankfully, Jennifer Lawrence was close behind her and confirmed her identity."

THE EYES HAVE IT

After photos of her transfigured visage became an Internet sensation, Renée, 45, finally addressed the issue. Laughing off talk of plastic surgery as "silly," she insisted, "I'm glad folks think I look different," and attributed her changed appearance to a "healthier, happier lifestyle." But an expert contacted by *Star* believes Renée has indeed gone under the knife.

"In my opinion, Renée could have had numerous procedures performed on her," says Beverly Hills-based plastic surgeon Dr. Ashkan Ghavami, who has not treated the actress. "The shape of her eyes has definitely changed. This could likely be from upper and lower eyelid surgery. And her lowered brow is usually a result of overzealous use of Botox." Dr. Ghavami, who calls Renée "beautiful," adds that her skin "looks good and may be the result of frequent facials, laser treatments and/or peels, which nearly everyone in front of the comercate."

Whatever the reason for her fresh-faced new look, Renée is clearly in a good place in her life.
